- Submit all official transcripts from high school and/or college.
- Submit additional materials (such as test scores).

Determine Your Eligibility

Prerequisite Criteria

All nursing applicants must meet these minimum prerequisite requirements:

- High school diploma or equivalency
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 in college, or 85 in high school (if seeking high school direct entry)
- Successful completion of high school or college algebra, biology, and chemistry
- If you hold a current LPN license, check online for separate criteria

Ways to Enter the Nursing Program

Admission by Nursing Points or TEAS Exam: These options are best for applicants with some college credit or a prior degree. Eligibility is based on a point system that evaluates academic history and performance in required courses. If you do not reach the minimum point value, you may take the TEAS exam as an alternate admissions pathway.

Health Care Studies Pathway: This pre-nursing track is ideal for applicants who need to complete nursing prerequisites and general education courses. Enroll in A.S. in Health Care Studies (Healthcare Track) and fulfill all requirements to be eligible for direct entry into the nursing program.

Accelerated Entry for LPNs: Current LPNs can reduce redundant coursework and gain advanced standing based on their academic history and performance on the National League for Nursing (NLN) Foundations of Nursing Exam.

High School Direct Entry: If you're a high school senior, we will review your educational background and goals to determine whether you need to take the TEAS exam, or start with health care studies.



Admission by Nursing Points

This entry option is best for applicants with some college credit or a prior degree. Admission is determined through a point system that considers academic history, performance in required courses, and other relevant factors.

You must earn at least 25 Nursing Admission Points to be considered for review. If you have not reached 25 points, you may take the TEAS exam as an alternate admissions pathway. Complete the self-evaluation form below to determine your eligibility.

Prerequisite Criteria

All nursing applicants must meet these minimum prerequisite requirements:

- High school diploma or equivalency
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 in college, or 85 in high school (if seeking high school direct entry)

Notice: Equivalency coursework at other colleges will be considered. After two unsuccessful attempts (grade of C- or lower, incomplete, NA, or withdraw) in any course above, Nursing Admissions Points will not be awarded for future successful completion of the course. BIO 171, 172 and 230 must be taken within seven years of matriculation into the nursing program.

Admission by TEAS Exam

This entry option provides an alternative pathway for candidates who did not earn 25 Nursing Admission Points. To be eligible for review, applicants will need to take the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) exam.

A minimum score of 65% on the TEAS exam is required to earn points and be ranked among all nursing candidates for that entry term.

About the TEAS Exam

The TEAS exam is a standardized test that evaluates readiness for programs in the health sciences, including nursing. Scores are good for two years from the application deadline date. Retesting is permitted once, and we encourage you to wait 30 days between testing attempts. Visit flcc.edu/teas to sign up for an exam date.

Health Care Studies Pathway

Our A.S. in Health Care Studies (Healthcare Track) is a pre-nursing pathway that introduces key healthcare concepts and helps you earn credits toward your nursing degree. You'll complete prerequisite and general education courses that meet our nursing requirements and prepare you to enter our nursing program.

Health Care Studies students who answer yes to all of the following criteria will be eligible for direct entry into the nursing program:
